So successful was this campaign that Moshe actually was forced to tell the people to STOP GIVING!

In any event, the generosity of the people knew no bounds and the Kohanim were soon to be initiated into the the Kehuna (the Priesthood).

Moreover, we are told that the construction of the Tabernacle, despite its great intrinsic holiness, could not be worked on in any way on the Sabbath, for Shabbat "trumped" even the Mishkan!

Lehavdil, Shabbat Parah contains a special Prophetic reading which deals with Tumah and Tahara --Purity and Impurity.

The ashes of a Red Heifer were sprinkled over a person defiled by contact with a dead body, and after a certain period of time the infected person would become pure again, ritually pure, to enable said person to fully participate in the eating of the Korban Pesach - one of the the rituals of preparing for Passover.

In contrast, the sprinkler of the ashes of the Red Heifer became impure, temporarily.

Even the wise King Solomon did not fully understand the rationale of this statute, called a CHOK, a law without explanation or obvious rationale.

Certainly, in our own time, we can become holy or unholy by our actions, thoughts, and deeds.

We have opportunities daily to do Mitzvot - good deeds - as well as other opportunities to do improper deeds, such as speaking Loshon Hore, etc.

May we always choose wisely and may we always choose LIFE!
