Please join me for services this Wednesday night for Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, wherein we ask forgiveness for ourselves and our loved ones and the entire Jewish community.

On October 4, we celebrate the first Shabbat following Yom Kippur, sedra HAAZINU, which contains a beautiful poem written by Moshe Rabeinu, shortly before his death. In it, he encapsulates and summarizes the entire history of the Jewish people.

On October 6th, we begin the festival of Sukkot/tabernacles, blessing Hashem for His bounty with Chol Hamoed Sukkot on Shabbat October 11.

The final days of Sukkot, which are actually two separate holidays, SHEMINI ATZERET and SIMCHAT



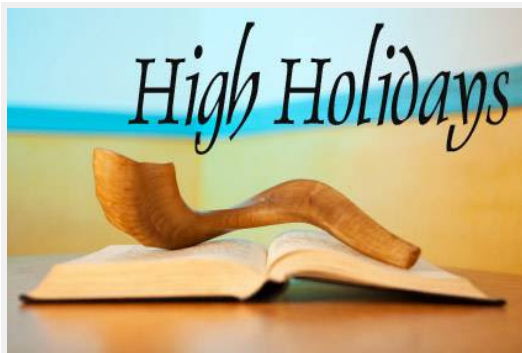

Kol Nidre- Wed., Oct. 1st- service starts 6:30 PM - NEW VENUE

Yom Kippur- Thurs., Oct. 2nd- service starts 9am- Yizkor approx. 1pm- break until 5pm (Mincha)- Neilah/final service ends approx.

TORAH, fall on October 14 and 15. Yizkor is recited on Shemini Atzeret, as well as Tefillat GESHEM, the prayer for rain.

On Simchat Torah, we rejoice with the Sifrei Torah, with everyone getting an Aliyah - even little children (KOL HANEARIM) and people who don't know Hebrew, etc.

Finally, on October 18th, we begin the Torah all over again (though we actually did this on Simchat Torah) - as we read the beginning of Bereishit/Genesis (no Phil Collins songs -- sorry) and we bless the new month as well.

This rounds out the main holidays of the next few weeks.
